





Storytelling: Accompanying Diagram for Students

Instructions for Teachers:

Below is a suggested diagram for students to fill in the parts of the story.

You can create titles and students can then briefly describe the section of the story being shared. The situations can be presented (either by reading or listening to a text) and you can ask students to give titles to each of the different sections of the story.

A title's purpose is to convey or hint to the important information in the text. It is also used to grab the reader's attention and arouse interest and curiosity.

There are also different types of titles.

You can also have students make specific references to characters, places, dilemma, emotions and more.

The goal is for the students to follow the course of the story and its details, and express their knowledge and insights regarding the shared story

This tool can also be used as an evaluation tool for teachers.







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
